School Health Services

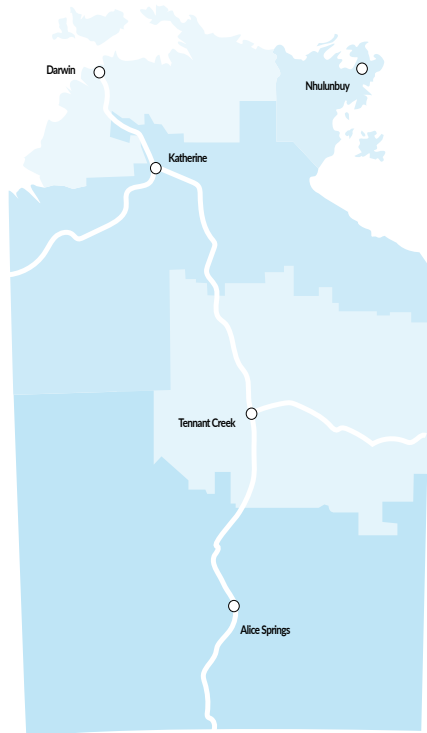
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What are School Health Services?

School Health Services provide health information to help students and parents make healthy choices.



They can also provide links to other services. These might include:

- Local Doctor
- Community Care Centre
- Dietitian
- Psychologist
- Alcohol and other drug service
- Sexual health service
- Dental service
- Counselling service.

Who provides the service?

The service is provided by the Department of Health and the Department of Education.

What services do Health Promoting School Nurses provide?

- Information and support to students to help them make decisions about their health, wellbeing and development
- Refer students to other health services for further assessments as required
- Work with teachers to support health education sessions
- Plan and deliver school Immunisation programs
- Run student health and wellbeing programs.

Where are the services?

Services are delivered by Health Promoting School Nurses and are available in Northern Territory Government middle and special needs schools. Services are based in Darwin, Nhulunbuy, Katherine, Tennant Creek and Alice Springs.
