## Guidelines for Success

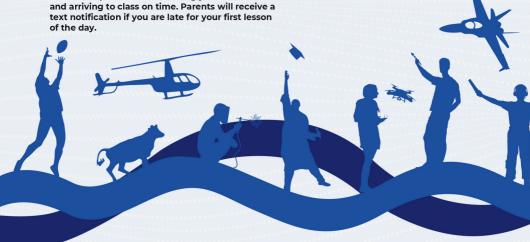
To help you make the most of your schooling experience, we follow a set of important guidelines:

- · Students remain in their class cohort for all core subjects in Years 7-9.
- · Students change classes for enrichment elective subjects.
- · Different teachers will guide you in different subject areas.
- · Subject choices and opportunities increase as you progress through the year levels.
- · School reports are issued once per semester, providing feedback on your grades.
- Positive behaviour is encouraged and recognised through a points system based on our core values: Inclusion, Respect, Effort, and Resilience-and you might even earn a free lunch!
- Lockers and fridges are not available, so vou'll need to carry your books, stationery, water bottle, and lunch in your bag. The canteen operates every day at recess and lunch.

 You are responsible for following your timetable and arriving to class on time. Parents will receive a text notification if you are late for your first lesson

### **Special Educational Needs and Wellbeing Programs**

At Katherine High School, we are dedicated to supporting the wellbeing and success of every student. We understand that some students may need extra support with learning or school readiness, and we are committed to providing the right help at the right time. Through personalised support and strong advocacy, our goal is to create a positive, inclusive school environment where every student feels valued, safe, and ready to learn.

Our Student Support and Wellbeing programs include:

- · Individualised timetables that provide students with dedicated time in the SEN and Wellbeing Hub.
- · Help with homework and assessments to keep students on track and confident in their learning.
- Targeted literacy and numeracy support to strengthen essential skills.
- · A safe and welcoming space available for students whenever they need a break or extra support.
- Advocacy for students and families, ensuring your child's needs are clearly communicated to teachers and school staff.
- Food and nourishment support available to help students maintain energy and concentration throughout the day.
- Activities to support emotional regulation, including calm conversations, grounding techniques, and low-impact games.
- Information about local wellbeing services, which students can access independently or with staff guidance.

Our Student Wellbeing and Inclusion Team also works closely with classroom teachers to help students engage with their learning and reach their full potential.

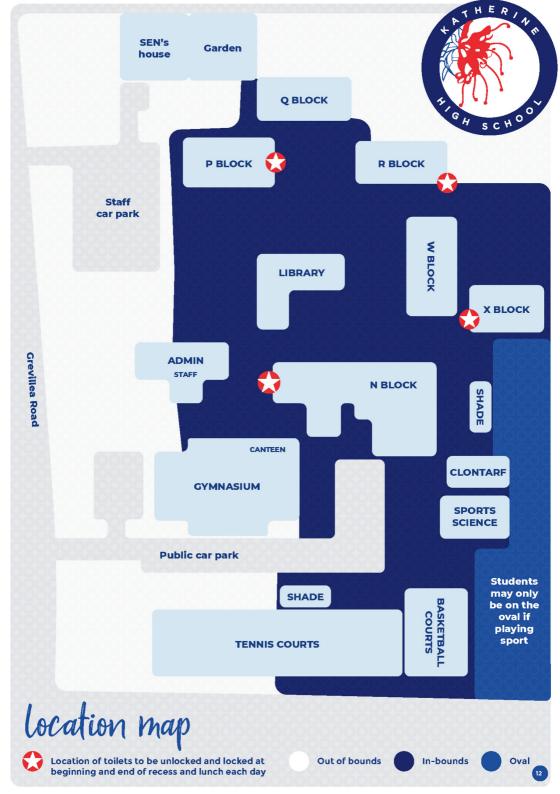
## STARS Foundation
