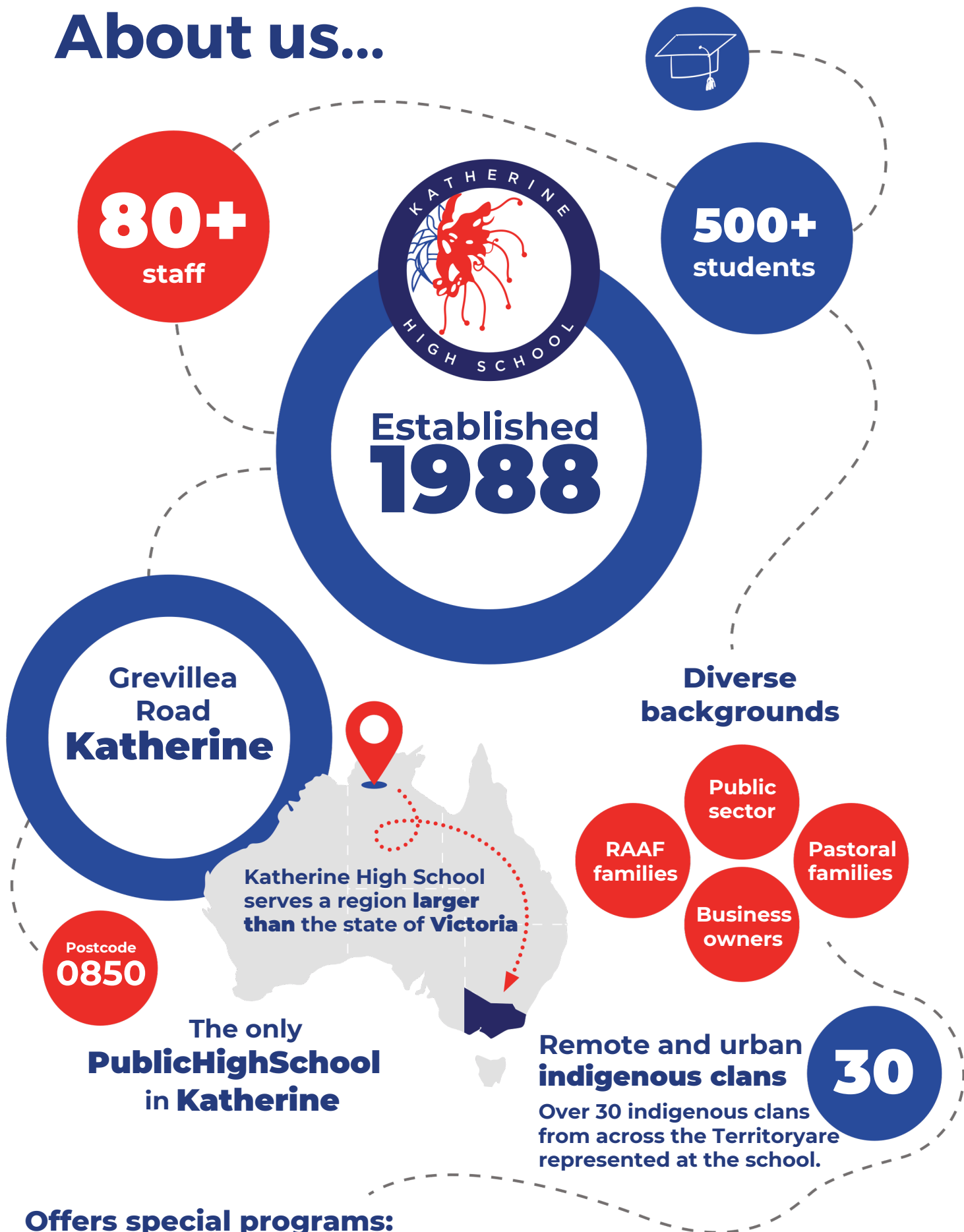

About the NTCET

The Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET) is awarded to students who successfully complete their senior secondary studies. It provides the knowledge and skills needed for further study, training, apprenticeships, or employment. The NTCET is delivered through the South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE).

Achieving the NTCET

Most students complete the NTCET over Years 10 to 12, earning a minimum of 200 credits across:

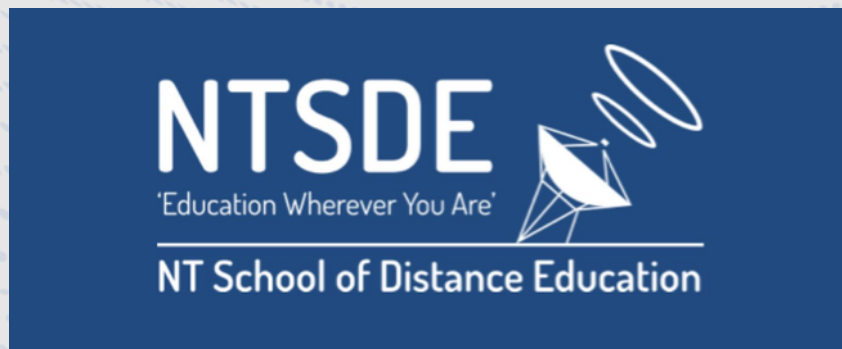
- Stage 1 subjects (typically semester-long)
- Stage 2 subjects (typically year-long)

Compulsory Requirements

To achieve the NTCET, students must complete:

- Exploring Identities and Futures (10 credits)
- Literacy requirement: English (20 credits)
- Numeracy requirement: Mathematics (10 credits)
-

A minimum grade of C is required for Stage 1 subjects and C- for Stage 2 subjects. Of the 200 credits required, at least 60 credits must be completed at Stage 2 level.

ATAR

The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) is a ranking from 0.00 to 99.95 that compares a student's achievement with other students of the same age across Australia. For example, an ATAR of 80.00 means a student performed better than 80% of their age group.

Universities use the ATAR, along with any applicable adjustments, to help select students for entry into courses. Some courses may also require additional selection criteria such as portfolios, auditions, interviews, tests, or personal statements.

Students are eligible for an ATAR upon successful completion of 90 Stage 2 credits. University applications are processed through tertiary admissions centres, including SATAC (SA/NT), TISC (WA), QTAC (QLD), UAC (NSW/ACT), and VTAC (VIC).

The NTCET Curriculum Pattern

To complete your NTCET (200 credits), you must:

- achieve an A, B or C for all the compulsory elements.
- achieve an A, B or C in 140 credits.

The Compulsory Elements are:

- Exploring Identities and Futures (10 credits)
- Literacy requirement (at least 20 credits) from a range of English subjects
- Numeracy requirement (at least 10 credits) from a range of mathematics subjects
- 60 credits of Stage 2 subjects or their equivalent

Students can also gain recognition for learning outside of school. This can include:

- Vocational Education and Training (VET).
- TAFE and university courses.
- Community learning (for example, Duke of Edinburgh's Award, Army Cadets).

Vocational Education & Training

VET provides students with practical, industry-focused skills and knowledge for the workplace. As part of the NTCET, VET courses allow students to gain nationally recognised qualifications while completing their senior studies, helping them build valuable experience and pathways to further training, apprenticeships, or employment.

VET operates through a national training system, particularly for trades and other industries. It is delivered, assessed, and certified by registered training organisations (RTOs), including TAFE. Katherine High School enjoys a working partnership with the Department of Education RTO to offer Certificates at school from VET Trainers in our on site workshops. Skill sets are offered to Year 9 with formal Certificate I and Certificate II qualifications offered to Senior Years students across Automotive, Building & Construction and Engineering and Manufacturing Pathways.

We also partner with Charles Darwin University (CDU) to deliver additional Certificates, including the very popular Certificate II in Rural Operations. Students have the opportunity to learn at the CDU rural campus with the majority of the training and assessing completed in two-week blocks delivered at the end of each term.

Each of these courses enables the students to learn practical trade skills and theory which are recognised nationwide in the form of national VET qualifications.

Additionally successful achievement in the Certificate I and II courses accumulate NTCET credits for Stage 1 and 2 which helps the students to graduate in Year 12. Students can gain recognition for up to 150 SACE credits at Stage 1 and/or Stage 2 for successfully completing specific VET courses. If you are thinking about becoming a carpenter, a builder, or mechanic, or want to experience station and stock work, then including VET in your NTCET could be the right choice for you.

Please note:

- Certificate I and II qualifications contribute credits at Stage 1 level
- Certificate III qualifications and above contribute credits at Stage 2 level

This allows students to gain nationally recognised qualifications while working towards their senior secondary certificate.



School-Based Apprenticeships

VET courses can be combined with a School Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship (SBAT), allowing students to begin their career pathway while completing their NTCET. Students work part-time, undertake industry training, and complete the first stage of their apprenticeship or traineeship, all while continuing their senior studies.

With a flexible timetable, students complete their NTCET requirements, including Literacy, Numeracy, and Exploring Identities and Futures (EIF), alongside workplace training and formal qualifications. This pathway enables students to graduate with their NTCET while gaining valuable industry experience, skills, and nationally recognised credentials.

Lilly is able to use her perspective as a hearing aid user to support empathetic and people focused care. Lilly has successfully completed her training. She was awarded the 2023 Group School-Based Apprentice of the Year Award, and went on to win the SBAT of the Year Award at the 2023 NT Training Awards, representing the NT at the Australian Training Awards. Having completed Year 12, Lilly is now studying medicine.

Certificate III in Automotive Electrical Technology

Aaron Cochrane began his training as a School-Based Apprentice, turning full-time with host business, CSA Contracting NT Auto Electrical & Air Conditioning in Katherine. Becoming a tradesman had always been his dream and as an Aboriginal student, he is proud to be a role model by pursuing a career in the trades. Before starting his apprenticeship, Aaron completed work experience at CSA, which helped him realise it was the right path. Aaron's passion for cars was sparked by his Pop, a bush mechanic who could fix anything with limited tools. Balancing work, life and school once affected his mental health. Now, Aaron hopes to inspire other apprentices to speak up and seek the support available. He credits his Mum and Nana for keeping him motivated. They often remind him: "Stick to your trade and do the best you can."

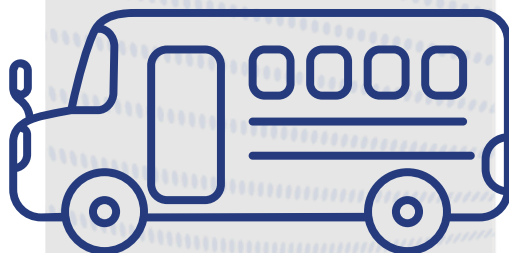


Bus service
